

## PRESS RELEASE

The British Go Association (BGA) welcomes Michael Redmond, one of the world's top Go Players on a tour of the UK next week, 30th March to 7th April.

Michael Redmond was originally born in the USA, but emigrated to Japan in 1977 at the age of 14 to study Go. Since then he has reached the top level of professional players, and he is now the strongest non-oriental player in the world.

This is the first time for many years that we have had the pleasure of welcoming such a prominent Go player to tour the UK to provide us with extensive teaching and we thank the Nihon Ki-in (Japan Go Association) for their sponsorship of this event. This is Michael's second offical Go visit to the UK, the first being as a commentator for one of the games for a Japanese professional title match.

Jon Diamond, President of the BGA said: "It is a great honour to be able to host Michael at so many locations across the UK. While Go is predominately an Oriental game – it is big in Japan, China and Korea, Michael has proved that Westerners can reach the top level and we hope to develop some of our younger players to emulate his success. While none of our UK players have a chance of beating Michael in an even game, we hope to learn from the experience and that he will leave an extensive legacy."

In the future we hope to receive similar tours sponsored by the equivalent organisations in

Korea, China and Taiwan.

About Go

Go is one of the top world mind sports: it was one of the 5 mind sports (along with Bridge, Chess, Draughts and Chinese Chess) played at the First and Second World Mind Sports Games in Beijing (2008) and Lille (2012). Go is the oldest mind sport, being about 3,000 years old, and has approximately 60 million players around the world. Whilst roughly 500 professionals are concentrated in the Far East, more than 60 countries are represented annually in the World Amateur Championship. Go is also known as Baduk in Korea and Weichi or Weiqi in China.

## About Michael Redmond

Michael Redmond was born in 1963 in Santa Barbara, California, and began playing Go at age 11. At the age of 14, he moved to Japan and became a pupil at the Nihon Ki-in (the Japan Go Association). He reached professional 1 dan (master grade) at age 18. He was promoted to 9 dan (the top grade) in 2000, becoming the first western Go professional to reach 9 dan.

Michael was runner-up in a number of Japanese Go tournaments in the early 1990s. Currently he is a celebrated commentator for a Japanese TV channel. In 2005, he was voted "Best Commentator" for the NHK channel. He is married with two daughters.
