1987 Annual General Meeting

This was held on 11 April during the British Go Congress. President Norman Tobin reported on the BGJ's problems and the appointment of Andrew MacPherson to oversee production. He appealed for more help especially on publicity.

He further appealed for help on Council as last year's Council was re-elected apart from two who did not re-stand and whose places were not filled.

The accounts for 1986 were passed despite the auditor's concern about the method of bookkeeping.

AOB discussed journal covers, Taiwanese rules and cash flow.

A new record length of 55 minutes was recorded.

Tournament results

The 1987 British Go Congress, held at the University of Reading on 10-12 April and sponsored by ICL Office Systems, attracted 120 players. Overall winner was John Rickard (Cambridge, 3 dan). Second place was Matthew MacFadyen (CLGC, 6 dan). Other prize winners in the main tournament were A Wall (CLGC, 1 dan); C Kirkham (Manchester, 1 kyu); S Butler (Reading, 2 kyu); M Charles (Hemel Hempstead, 2 kyu); M Cocke (Norwich, 4 kyu), who also took the Young Player prize; M Munro (Bristol, 8 kyu); P Barnard (CLGC, 8 kyu); N Cleverley (Bournemouth, 11 kyu); F Mitchell (Manchester, 14 kyu); S Field (Furze Platt, 15 kyu); and P Dillon (Bournemouth, 19 kyu). The winning team was the "Bristol Bombers". Qualifiers were J Bond and and L Naef. The lightning tournament was won by T M Hall (Bristol, 3 dan); A Scarff (Reading, 1 dan) took second place; and S Field (Furze Platt, 15 kyu) was third.
