TOURNAMENT RESULTS

International Teams Tournament

Sunday 13th October

Seven teams of six players played in this event held at the Nippon Club in London. Unfortunately there was no Korean team and the Chinese had to borrow a few of the weaker Londoners. Playing for the first time Reading surprised themselves by winning 16/24 games to take the trophy. Second on 13 points were Nippon 1, Nippon 2 and CLGC 2; Wanstead got 12, CLGC 1 got 10 and China 8. The only player to win four was Shutai Zhang (7 dan China). Those on 3/4 were K. Okubo, B. Okamura, N. Uda, H. Naka, U. Nagoa, Piers Shepperson, David Ward, Martin Smith, Andrew Jones, Jim Clare, Tony Atkins, Simon Goss and Clive Hendrie.

27th Wessex Go Tournament

Sunday 27th October

106 players battled through the drizzle to a newly refurbished Marlborough Town Hall for the 27th Wessex. Winner was John Rickard of Cambridge (4 dan) whose stamina coped with the four rounds and the end of summer time. The other 9 division prizes (engraved tankards) went to: Jo Hampton (2 dan West Wales); John Hobson (1 dan Bath); Christian Scarff (1 kyu Swindon); Jackie Chai (2 kyu Bournemouth); Pauk Clarke (3 kyu High Wycombe); David Stephenson (6 kyu HP Bristol); Pete Johnson (8 kyu Hursley); Keith Osborne (12 kyu Reading); Michael Talyanski (15 kyu High Wycombe). Of these winners divisions 5, 8, 9 and 10 won all 4 games. Not suprisingly High Wycombe won the team prize. Young Carl Bate (25 kyu Brakenhale) won the Fred Guyatt prize for 13x13. Both Jackie and Christian qualified for the 1997 Candidates' Tournament.

Three Peaks Tournament

Weekend 9-10th November

The joint winners were Alistair Wall (4 dan Wanstead) with 4/5 and Henni Groot Lipman (1 dan) who started below the bar but won 5/5.

Swindon Go Tournament

Sunday 24th November

86 players attended the tournament which was won by Mark Hall (4 dan Bristol) with 3/3. Other prize winners with 3/3 were: Paul Clarke (3 kyu High Wycombe), Mike Talyansky (12 kyu High Wycombe), Darrell Sturley (21 kyu Monmouth), Yvonne Margetts (21 kyu Epsom Downs) and Youngik Kim (30 kyu Brakenhale) who also won the 13x13 competition. The lightning was won by Jiri Keller (CLGC).

West Surrey Handicap Tournament

Sunday 8th December

The tournament was preceded, as usual, by a teaching day on the Saturday in which 26 players were instructed by 4 senior players. The tournament itself aims for handicap games of about four stones and uses a scheme that favours black. Nevertheless, the player who emerged the champion from the 50 competitors was Mark Hall (4 dan Bristol) with 4/4. Other players with 4/4 were: France Ellul (3 kyu High Wycombe) and Alistair Brooks (27 kyu Swindon). Also mentioned in despatches were the players with 3/4: John Rickard, Tony Atkins, Gerry Mills, Clive Wright, Eddie Blockley, Paul Clarke, Colin Weeks, S. Ashing, Mike Talyansky, G. Farrimond, Neil Ings, O. Edwards and J. Ballentyre. The kyu section quiz was won by Anna Griffiths and the dan section by Tony Atkins. The 13x13 competition was won by Elinor Brooks.

British Championship:

The fourth game of the British Championship was played at West Surrey and Shutai Zhang emerged the winner to retain his title by a 3-1 margin.

BGA membership. Subscriptions for 1997 are now due. For 1997 the BGA has decided to convert to the direct mailing of newsletters and journals to all members. For those who were not at the AGM earlier in the year, the reasons for this include:

A better servcie for members who will receive journals regardless of their (or their club secretary's) attendance at club meetings.

Easier distribution for the newsletter and journal editors.

Better contact information about members enabling contact to be re-established with lapsed members who have stopped attending local clubs. The new membership rates for 1997 are:

UK adult £9, UK junior, unemployed or OAP £4.50, Overseas Europe £10, Overseas other £12, Family £14. Family membership allows up to two adults and their children to enjoy all the benefits of membership whilst receiving just one copy of the journal and the newsletter. Benefits include: 4 journals and 6 newsletters a year, the ability to purchase books and equipment, and reduced tournament entry fees.
