RESULTS

Orient-West Match, London, 17 June 2001 The last Anglo-Japanese match to be held at the Daiwa attracted a total of 16 players. We should call this the "Oriental" versus "Western" match as we had a mixture of Korean, Chinese and 1 Japanese players, with some westerners loaned to the Oriental team. The Oriental team won 18 to 12 Only Xiang Dong Wang achieved 4 wins out 4. Players on 3 wins were Kiyohiko Tanaka, Michael Zhang, Alex Rix, and Bill Streeten who floated between the Oriental and the Western teams.

Welsh Open, Barmouth, 23-24 June 2001 43 players entered. Matthew Macfadyen continued his dominance of the event with a straight five wins. Second on 4 wins was David Ward (3 dan Cambridge) ahead of Francis Roads (4 dan Wanstead), Bob Bagot (2 dan Devon) and Alistair Wall (4 dan Wanstead). Tom Widdecombe (3 kyu Devon) was the only other player unbeaten. Peter Fisher (4 kyu Leicester), Ron Bell (4 kyu Reading), Shawn Hearn (9 kyu Berkshire Youth) and Mogens Jakobsen (10 kyu Epsom Downs) all won 4 games.

Youth Grand Prix 2001 There is a Youth Grand Prix competition for under 18's, which runs throughout the year. You can score points by playing in Go tournaments during the year. Following the Welsh Open in Barmouth, the scores so far for this year are: 1st Lasse Jacobsen (15 kyu Epsom Downs) with 920 points, 2nd Ian McAnally (8 kyu Manchester) 712 points, 3rd Paul Blockley 22 kyu Worcester 682 points. Scottish Open, Edinburgh, 7-8 July 2001 The result was a three-way tie (on 4 out of 5 wins each) between John Rickard (4 dan), Quentin Mills (3 dan) and Dan Micsa (2 dan). Quentin was declared the winner because his opponents had won more games, and he thus retained his title from last year. Dan Micsa was second, and John Rickard was third. Also on 4 wins were: Jim Taylor (3 kyu), Roger Daniel 3 kyu) and Gordon Reid (8 kyu). John Rickard won the Lightning Tournament winning 3 out of 3 games.


