# British Go Journal Index

BGJ 101-200

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## Notes

- Bold headings are main headings.
- Bold numbers are issue numbers, followed by a colon and non-bold page number(s).
- The front cover, inside front cover, inside back cover, and back cover pages are indicated by fc, ifc, ibc, and bc, respectively; special centre pages by c.
- An asterisk \* behind page numbers indicates one or more pictures.
- Superscript letters TL, TC, TR, CL, CC, CR, BL, BC, <sup>BR</sup> behind page numbers indicate one of nine page sectors (top left, top centre, etc. to bottom right) if the page number alone would be too vague to locate an indexed item, especially non-verbatim ones. TL\*, <sup>BR</sup>\*, etc. correspond to pictures.
- Superscript numbers behind an asterisk \*1, \*<sup>2</sup> are 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, etc. from left or clockwise from bottom left in group pictures. If there is more than one row of people, superscript \*<sup>F1</sup>, \*<sup>F2</sup>, \*<sup>M1</sup>, \*<sup>M2</sup>, \*<sup>B1</sup>, \*<sup>B2</sup>, etc. distinguish front, middle, back rows followed by position from left.
- Quotation marks mainly indicate original titles of articles.
- Italics indicate titles of books, journals, and films.
- Japanese, Chinese, and Korean names are given with the family name first without a comma in between (unless there is a Western given name).
- A '?' in name entries indicates a missing given name, a '(?)' an unclear identity.
- Japanese technical terms are either index entries or cross-references to their more popular English equivalents.
- Problems are indexed according to the technique involved in the first move. Many problems are indexed with a second technique involved in later moves.
- Game records in the BGJ are given either in full or in part; if a game just features a position or a limited number of moves, a hint is given in parentheses. The event, year, and number of handicap stones (if any) are given in parentheses as well.

 Joseki are indexed as 3-4, 4-4 point joseki, etc. Joseki specified by their second move are indexed e.g. as 'knight approach (3-4 point joseki)'. Joseki specified by their third move are indexed e.g. as 'one-space high pincer against knight approach (3-4 point joseki)' or by specific names such as 'attach-and-draw back' and 'avalanche'.

# Depth of indexing

Indexed topics have a minimum length or equivalent space of about five lines without columns, about ten lines per column in a twocolumn layout or about 15 lines in a threecolumn layout; anything smaller including passing mentions is not indexed.

## Index coverage

Advertisements, tables of contents, copyright information, credits, contributors, association contacts, glossary, and similarly repetitive items are not included in the index. However, repetitive items with changing contents like club lists and BGA officials are included.

# Sorting

Main headings are sorted word-by-word, that is, blanks take precedence over letters (nothing before something). Diacritics are sorted in the same way as their basic letter; note that the usage of diacritics in the BGJ is not consistent. Prepositions at the beginning of subheadings are ignored in sorting.

# Tips for searching

Simply look up topics directly. If they are not in the index, they are probably either not covered in the BGJ or too small and thus not indexed (see depth of indexing above). The main headings are controlled by numerous cross-references. Think of the index as a three-dimensional knowledge space with general, specific and related items linked with each other. The following 16 main headings represent broader concepts and provide a hierarchical top-down approach to more specific concepts, so that index users are able to discover what is available:

Go	strategic aspects
equipment	shape and technique
British Go Association	life and death
<u>clubs</u>	problems
players	media
events	reviews
games	teaching
game stages	computer Go

For example, the main entry 'events' refers among others to 'tournaments' which in turn refers to the generic narrower 'youth tournaments'. The latter entry leads to specific youth tournaments by name. Another example is the main entry 'game stages' which among others refers to 'fuseki' which leads to 'Chinese fuseki'; the latter refers to special types of the Chinese fuseki.
