News

Considering that NOT The Oxford Go Tournament (Wanstead House, Feb. 24th) was fixed up at less than three weeks notice, the entry of 82 was very gratifying. Even more gratifying was the strong entry (18) from players graded 15 kyu and below. First prize went to Matthew Macfayden, pictured later in the Redbridge Gazette and Guardian, and the other prizewinners were P. Shepperson, (SLGC, 3 dan), C. Stevenson, (Chester, 1 dan), S. Paterson (CLGC, 2 kyu), V. Baldwin, (Ipswich, 4 kyu), P. Collins, (Malvern, 10 kyu), S. Bint, (3 Counties, 12 kyu), S. Chapman, (3 Counties, 12 kyu,) A. Jones, (Cambridge, 17 kyu), P. Barnard, (Reading, 15 kyu), and R. Higham, (St. Dunstans, 27 kyu). Chris Whitehouse won the wooden spoon for the strongest player with no wins, and Neil Symes may not realise that he won a candidates place, owing to an erroneous announcement made at the time.

Eight teams from four schools entered the Schools Championship at Furze Platt Comprehensive School on March 10th. First were Furze Platt 'A', second Woodroffe from Lyme Regis, and third Furze Platt 'B'. There were book prizes, and owing to Equity and Law's generous sponsorship no team and no individual participant came away empty handed. Michael Wale wore a Go tie and trailed the event on the TV programme London Plus, and reports were printed in the Maidenhead Advertiser and Bucks Free Press. Organisation was by France Ellul.

For the last three years, Terry Stacey has won the Trigantius Tournament. He didn't win this year, losing in round three to this year's winner Jim Barty, (CLGC, 4 dan). There were 59 entrants, and the other prizewinners were B. Ellis (Hemel Hempstead, 1 kyu), A. Thornton, (Hemel Hempstead, 2 kyu), B. Chandler, (Reading, 3 kyu), A. Jones, (Cambridge, 15 kyu), and R. Taillefer, (Cambridge, 15 kyu).

Richard Granville will not be seeking re-election as President at the AGM. Norman Tobin has stated his willingness to take over; the BGA will therefore be looking for a new Secretary (or President) as well as at least two new ordinary Committee members. All offers to the Secretary a.s.a.p. One or two new members are also sought for the Schools Sub-committee.
