THE ASAHI LONDON RAPID-GO TOURNAMENT:

First some statistics: 149 Go players attended this event, of whom 66 were of dan grade. There were 84 Brits and the remaining 65 players came from 13 different countries, (the Isle of Man contingent considered that should be 14). There were 45 prizes awarded.

The winner was S. Zhang (6d, CHI) with 4/4.

THE ASAHI LONDON OPEN: (EGP)

This event attracted 166 players about half of whom were non-British from 17 different countries.

There were 79 dan players. Altogether, 54 prizes were awarded.
